

LOOKING FORWARD TO PENTECOST:

The Fourth Sunday of Easter marks the midpoint of the 50 days of Easter season and constitutes a kind of unofficial feast we might call "Good Shepherd Sunday." And we always have part of John Chapter 10 as our Gospel reading, - the famous "Good Shepherd discourse."

On this Sunday we stop reading the Gospels about the post-Resurrection appearances of Our Lord, and beginning next week we start meditating on Jesus' teaching on the Holy Spirit (John 14-17). Thus, this day marks a shift from remembering Easter to looking forward to Pentecost.


