Cheap Grace and Costly Grace

"Cheap grace is the preaching of for-
giveness without requiring repentance,
Baptism without Church discipline, Com-
munion without confession, absolution
without personal confession. Cheap grace
is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross,
grace without Jesus Christ living and incarnate.

Costly grace is the treasure hidden in the field; for the sake
of it a man will gladly go and sell all that he has. It is the
pearl of great price, to buy which the merchant will sell all
his goods. It is the kingly rule of Christ, for whose sake a
man will pluck out the eye which causes him to stumble; it
is the call of Jesus Christ at which the disciple leaves his
nets and follows him.

Costly grace is the Gospel which must be sought again
and again, the gift which must be asked for, the door at
which a man must knock. Such grace is costly because it
calls us to follow, and it is grace because, freely given, it
calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs
a man his life, and it is grace because through it, God
gives a man the only true life. It is costly because it con-
demns sin, and grace because through it God justifies the
sinner. Above all, it is costly because it cost God the life
of his Son: "you were bought at a price," and what has
cost God much cannot be cheap for us. Above all, it is
grace because God did not reckon his Son too dear a price
to pay for our life but freely and with love for us, deliv-
ered him up for us. Costly grace is the Incarnation of God.

of noble souls who risked their lives for the sake of others.

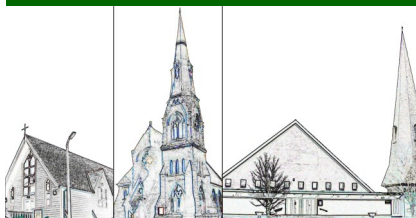
*My selfless and sacrificial Lord, You not only commanded us

ABABA PROJECT NEWS & NEW SCHOOL YEAR. In Ethiopia, the new school year starts this September, with the fantastic news about the progress among 'our children'. Three of the girls we have sponsored since they were in Kindergarten have taken the Year 12 exams, which will get them into university. We pray for their success and continued education. New sponsors are required and may join the scheme. It costs £240 per year, which you may pay annually, monthly by D/D or through the green cash envelopes.
